2. On the way home, Clyde thinks about Joseph, his brother. What were his thoughts? \* 1 point

- a. Clyde resents Joseph and thinks he can never be as smart as Joseph is.
- b. Clyde wonders what Joseph thinks of him and whether Joseph is embarrassed to have him as a brother.
- c. Clyde is jealous of Joseph's good looks and hero status.
- d. Clyde loves and misses Joseph and tries not to blame Joseph when nobody pays any attention to him (Clyde).

3. Describe Cabbagetown. \*

- a. Cabbagetown is a suburb of Atlanta. The small houses are built of local stone. In the front, the houses have a window on both sides of the door and a small porch. There is a coal-burning stove in the living room, and there are two bedrooms upstairs.
- b. Cabbagetown is a rural community near train tracks. The wood houses are painted many different colors, which at one time must have made them seem cheerful, but their peeling paint and run-down condition make the town seem sad. Some of the screened porches on the front of the houses are falling down, probably because the houses shake when the trains go by.
- c. Cabbagetown is a mill village. The houses have wood frames, peeling paint, two small windows in front, a tiny covered porch, and perhaps a patch of grass. They are small (though they have a fireplace), are located near train tracks, and shake when trains go by.
- d. Cabbagetown is a village in Georgia. The houses are made of brick with two windows in front and a small porch. There is a kerosene stove in the kitchen, but they are heated by a wood stove. There are two bedrooms upstairs. There is no electricity or running water.

4. What does Clyde not like about where he lives? \*
