

Discussion Questions

Chapter One

- 1. Who is the narrator of this book? (Harold, the family dog, xi-xii, introduction)
- 2. Describe the discovery of the rabbit. (The Monroes went to the theater and Toby sat on something. They found on Toby's chair a little blanketed bundle. -p.8)
- 3. Tell how the family came up with the name "Bunnicula". (Mrs. Monroe suggested they call him Bunny-cula or Bunnicula, because he is a bunny and he was found at a Dracula movie p. 15)

Chapter Two

- 1. How is Chester different from an ordinary cat? (Chester is different from other cats in that he developed a taste for reading early in his life. Every night Chester curls up in his favorite chair and reads a book. p.19)
- 2. Why is Chester suspicious of Bunnicula? (Chester noticed a peculiar marking on his forehead and when the rabbit smiled he noticed two little pointed fangs. p. 20, 23)

Chapter Three

- 1. What does the family discover when they look in the refrigerator the next morning? (a white tomato p.32)
- 2. Why is Harold unable to play with Bunnicula during the daytime? (He could never wake Bunnicula up, he was always sleeping during the day. p.27)
- 3. What did Chester discover when he looked at the white tomato? (Teeth marks p.36)

Chapter Four

- What three things does Chester think are strange about Bunnicula? (The rabbit sleeps all day, he has funny little sharp teeth, and he gets in and out of his cage by himself. p.45)
- 2. What did Chester discover on the floor by the refrigerator? (a white zucchini -p.52)

Chapter Five

- 1. How does Chester try to convince the Monroes that Bunnicula is a vampire bunny? (Chester came in the room with Mr. Monroe's towel wrapped around him like a cape, and he bit Harold on the neck. p.56-59)
- 2. What did Mrs. Monroe think was Chester's problem? (Mrs. Monroe thought Chester needed some love and attention p.60)

Chapter Six

- 1. Why does Chester wear garlic around his neck? (Chester's book, "The Mark of the Vampire", said that garlic renders vampires immobile. p.65)
- 2. Why did Chester pound Mrs. Monroe's steak on Bunnicula's chest? (Chester's book said to pound a stake into the vampire's heart. Chester mistook the word to mean "steak". p.72-73)
- 3. What happened to Chester after he ruined Mrs. Monroe's steak? (Mrs. Monroe put Chester outside. -p.75)

Chapter Seven

- 1. How are Harold's feelings changing toward Bunnicula? (He began to think of Bunnicula as a friend. -p.79)
- 2. Why is Harold worried about Bunnicula? (Bunnicula looked tired and listless and his nose felt warmer than usual. -p.79)

Chapter Eight

- 1. Describe the scene as Bunnicula gets his first bite of food in days. (Chester leaped across the table and landed on top of Bunnicula. Bunnicula jumped up and landed in the salad bowl. -p.87)
- 2. What do the Monroes decide to do with their pets the next day? (Take them all to the vet -p.90)

Chapter Nine

- 1. How does Bunnicula's new diet solve everyone's problem? (Because Bunnicula was fed vegetable juice, he no longer needed to suck the juice out of vegetables. Chester was diagnosed as being emotionally overwrought and began seeing a cat psychiatrist and Harold didn't have to take his shots. p.93-94)
- 2. How does going to the cat psychiatrist affect Chester? (Chester decides he needs to find himself. He reads books like, "Finding Yourself by Screaming a Lot". He thinks he is getting in touch with his kittenhood. p.96,97)
