

Using Predictions

We all make predictions as we read—little guesses about what will happen next, how the conflict will be resolved, which details given by the author will be important to the plot, which details will help to fill in our sense of a character. Students should be encouraged to predict, to make sensible guesses. As students work on predictions, these discussion questions can be used to guide the process of the ways to predict? What is the process of a sophisticated der inking and predicting? What clues does an author give us to help us in the purpose predictions? Why are some predictions more likely than others?
