

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

#### Chapters 1–4, pp. 1–35


- 1. \*Identify the place and year as the story begins. How many years elapse between the setting for the novel and the date Hugo wrote the book? Why do you think he includes this information?

- 5. \*What is your interpretation of Gringoire's play?
- 6. Name three things that interrupt Gringoire's production. How does Gringoire respond to the interruptions?
- 7. \*Prediction: What do you think the election of a Pope of Fools signifies?

## Chapters 5-11, pp. 35-64

- 1. Identify and describe the Pope of Fools. How does the crowd react to him?
- 2. \*What is the final blow to the performance of Gringoire's play? How does he respond? What do you think this reveals about him?
- 3. Where does Gringoire go? Briefly describe this place.
- 4. Describe Esmeralda. What is her goat's name?
- 5. \*What does the sinister man in the crowd shout about Esmeralda? Why do you think he does so?
- 6. Who is Sacky? What does she call Esmeralda?
- 7. Identify the three groups of gypsies in the coronation parade to honor Quasimodo.
- 8. \*How does Quasimodo react to being elected the Pope of Fools? What do you think this implies about him?
- 9. Who interrupts Quasimodo's coronation? How does he do so? How does Quasimodo react to him?
- 10. What does Gringoire observe as he follows Esmeralda? What does Gringoire do? How does this confrontation end?
- 11. \*Whom does Gringoire think is with Quasimodo? What do you think this indicates?


