

- 1. *Identify and describe Gregor Samsa and explain what happens to him. Do you think this is a dream or reality?
- 2. How does Gregor feel about his job and his boss? Why does he remain in this job?
- 3. *How do members of Gregor's family react to his failure to go to work on time? Why don't they come into his room to help him? What family member do you think is most sympathetic to Gregor? Why do you think so?
- 4. *Identify symptoms of Gregor's metamorphosis. What happens to him when he tries to get out of bed? Why do you think he tries to protect his head?
- 5. Who arrives to check on Gregor? How does Gregor feel about his arrival? How does his family react?
- 6. *What does the office manager accuse Gregor of doing? Do you think his charges are valid? Why or why not?
- 7. How does Gregor open his door? What physical effect does this have on him?
- 8. How do the members of Gregor's family and the office manager react to his appearance?
- 9. What happens to Gregor? Why?
- 10. *Prediction: Will Gregor return to his normal state? If not, what will happen to him?
- 11. *Activity: Draw a caricature of the office manager or of Gregor as an insect.
- 12. *Activity: Write a name poem for Gregor and Grete.


- 1. *Identify at least four changes in Gregor following his metamorphosis. Which do you think will have the most profound effect on the Samsas' lives?


Directions: Fill in the ovals to indicate what the author has revealed about Gregor Samsa.
