

Chapter 1, pp. 1-4

- 1. *What is revealed in this chapter (narrator, location, circumstances, etc.)?
- 2. What has happened to Manderley?

Chapter 2, pp. 5-11

- 1. What is revealed about the narrator and Maxim de Winter? Why do they travel from place to place?
- 2. *Write the simile that describes Manderley at the present time. What do you think this means?
- 3. Activity: Prepare an acrostic for HAPPINESS.

Chapter 3, pp. 12-20

- 1. Who is Mrs. Van Hopper and what is her role in the narrator's life?
- 2. *What do you now know about the narrator?
- 3. Activity: Draw a caricature of Mrs. Van Hopper.

Chapter 4, pp. 21-33


- 1. What change in circumstances allows the narrator to spend time with Maxim de Winter? How do they become acquainted and spend their time together? What effect does he have on the narrator?
- 2. List the given facts about Maxim de Winter and Manderley.
- 3. Activity: Duplicate Rebecca's signature as described.

Chapter 5, pp. 34-43

- 1 *Explain the universality of the statement, "I'd like to keep this moment and never forget it" (p. 37).
- 2. *What do you think the "great gulf" (p. 37) between Maxim and the narrator represents? Explain your answer, noting pages 37-41.
- 3. Why does Rebecca become a phantom to the narrator?
