




- 1. *What do you think the introductory statement, "A ship that doesn't sail, never reaches port" (p. 3), means?

- 4. How old is Esmeralda when her family first comes to Macún? Briefly describe their house.
- 5. *What does Esmeralda call her parents? Describe her relationship with each of them.
- 6. Identify Esmeralda's nickname, and explain its significance.
- 7. *Where does Papi tell Mami he is going? How long is ne gone? What happens when he returns? Why do you think this incident is significant?
- 8. Identify Margie and Provi. What does Esmeralda want to do when she learns about Margie? How do her parents react?
- 9. When Esmeralda starts school, what does she learn about the following: dignity, other families, fighting? Why does she "fight naked"?
- 10. Why do Mami and the children move to the city?
- 11. *How do you think the introductory statement, "He falls in love even with broomsticks" (p. 21), relates to Papi's lifestyle?
- 12. *Prediction: Will Mami and Papi reconcile after she moves to the city?
