Objective:		

The play is titled *Fences*. In a previous activity, you were asked to analyze how the title might affect characters or motifs in the story. In the previous scene, Troy wanted his son, Cory, to help him build a fence. At the beginning of this scene, Rose sings a religious song about one:

ROSE: (sings) Jesus, be a fence all around me every day
Jesus, I want you to protect me as I travel on my way.
Jesus, be a fence all around me every day.

(Troy enters from the house)

ROSE: (continued): Jesus, I want you to protect me as I travel on my way.

Rose uses the word fence metaphorically in her religious song to discuss protection. Although this is only the second scene of the first act, make at least five hypothesises as to what Rose might need protection from. Consider her status in society as an African-American wife and mother and the relationships she has with family members.

Applying "Fences" to Life

Objective: Spending money wisely

Activity

Troy and Cory have a debate about whether to buy a new television or not. Cory believes his father should just spend the \$200 on the television. Troy, however, believes the money would be better spent on repairing the roof.

TROY: While you thinking about a TV, I got to be thinking about the roof...and whatever else go wrong around here. Now if you had two hundred dollars, what would you do...fix the roof or buy a TV?

CORY: I'd buy a TV. Then when the roof started to leak...when it needed fixing...I'd fix it.

TROY: Where you gonna get the money from? You done spent it for a TV. You gonna sit up and watch the water run all over your brand new TV.

Imagine that you are Cory, and Troy has given you \$200. Troy has allowed you to make the financial decision to either buy the television you want or to hire someone to repair the roof. Which decision would you make and why? Write a brief paragraph explaining your decision. Remember, you currently have only \$200 but you want to get both objects. If you chose to buy the television, how will you repair the roof when it leaks? If you chose to repair the roof, how will you buy your television?
