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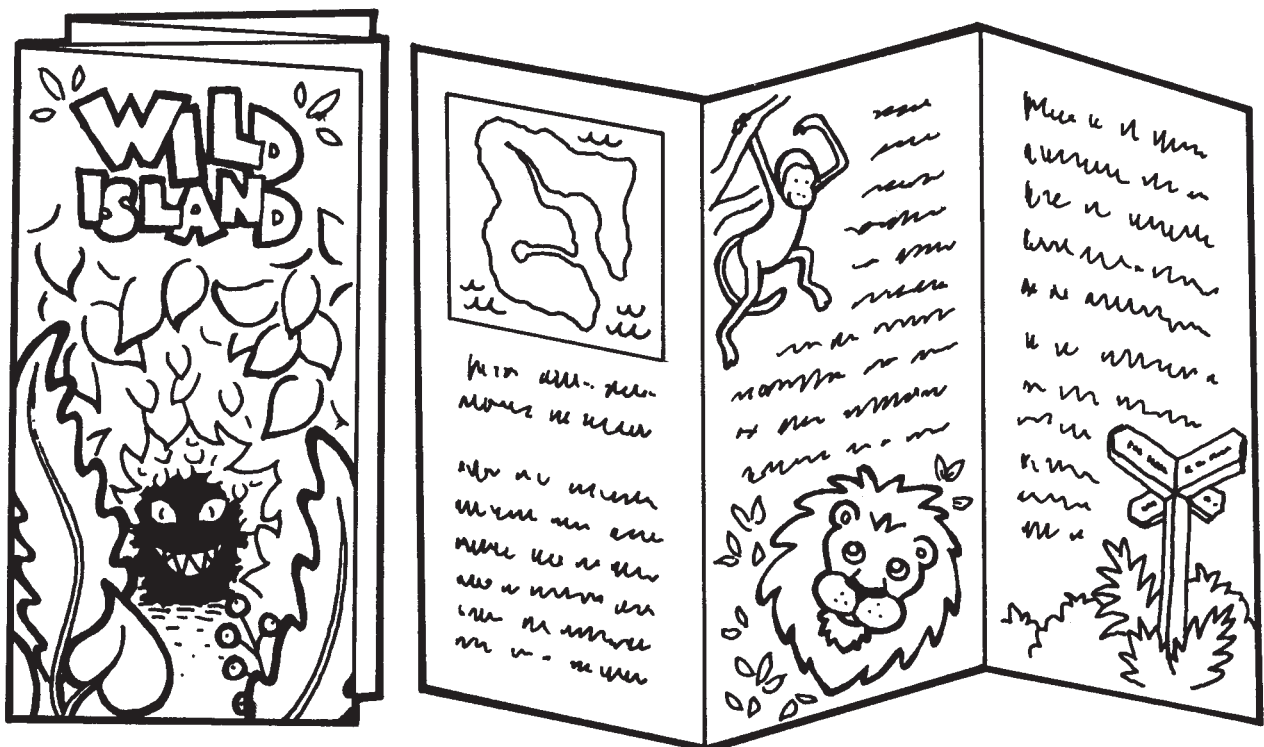
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Travel Brochure

2. If one crocodile weighs 1,125 pounds, how much will 9 crocodiles weigh? _____
3. One tiger weighs 250 pounds. What is the total weight of four tigers? _____
4. If the gorilla weighs 356 pounds and the rhinoceros weighs 2,160 pounds, what is their total weight? _____
5. One of the crocodiles has a lion and a monkey on his back. The lion weighs 300 pounds and the monkey weighs 55 pounds. How much weight is on the crocodile's back? _____
6. A lion can live for 24 years. A rhinoceros can live for 16 more years than a lion. How old can a rhinoceros live to be? _____
7. Each of the 6 monkeys has 4 legs. How many legs are on the 6 monkeys altogether? _____
8. If each of the 17 crocodiles is 12 feet long and they are stretched end to end across the wide and muddy river, how wide is the river? _____
9. Elmer packed two-dozen pink lollipops. If he gave 17 of them to the crocodiles, how many did he have left? _____
10. Elmer braided the lion's forelock, containing 21 strands of hair. If he divided them into groups of three, how many braids were formed in the lion's forelock? _____
